### Mayor's Corner: Projects!

**B**ountiful is becoming more beautiful – with your help!

We are constructing and planning some major projects that we hope you will help make better. Construction has already begun at Creekside Park on Mill Street, and will continue through late fall. The park will then have a “grow-in” period to give the flora and fauna a chance to take root so it can flourish. We are planning a grand opening to take place next spring. Resident participation was a major part of planning this project and the final design reflects many of your ideas. We think this will be such a peaceful oasis in the middle of our beautiful City that all will enjoy for generations to come.

Next up is our downtown plaza project! This exciting plan has been years in the making and deliberately studied, examined and reviewed to make sure it makes the most sense for the use of the funds, buildings and land. We are excited to add activity and vibrancy to Bountiful’s “living room,” and make City Hall a part of our historic downtown. Many of you attended our informational open house in March to ask questions and

learn more about the project, and we look forward to hearing from you again as the planning process goes forward. **Our first public meeting to hear your ideas for the plaza will be held on Thursday, August 18.** The time for this meeting, and dates and times for additional meetings, will be announced on our website ([www.bountifulutah.gov](http://www.bountifulutah.gov)) and Facebook, Instagram and Twitter (follow us on these sites from our website). You can also call (801.298.6140) or email ([info@bountifulutah.gov](mailto:info@bountifulutah.gov)) with questions, suggestions or ideas. With input from our citizens, we expect the plaza to be inviting to families and functional for events and activities including the Farmer’s Market, the Chalk Art Festival and the Coats for Kids Car Show presented by the Rotary Club. An interactive water feature is also planned. There is still more to be decided, though, so please bring us your ideas and enthusiasm.

Information provided at the March open house—answers to frequently asked questions about the project and a time line—can be found on the home page of our website. These documents de-



scribe what happened when in the decision making process, where the funds are coming from for the project and other helpful information. Construction on the plaza and municipal building should start sometime next summer and will take approximately a year. We look forward to meeting with you again on August 18!

On another note, I want to sincerely thank everyone who gives so generously of their time, service and means for the many outstanding events that take place in our City! The Chalk Art Festival, the Car Show, Concerts in the Park, Handcart Days, Summerfest, Tour of Utah, Preparedness Seminars, etc. could not happen without all of you pitching in! I’m so proud to be a part of our great community of wonderful people!

# Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up

Full cleanup is October 10–14. During that week on your regular garbage pickup day, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed in addition to the regular pick up. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and **tyed with twine** in five foot lengths. Any bundles, bags or boxes must not exceed 50 pounds. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. Items such as old furniture or appliances should be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. **Please place your items out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.**

Also, to assist you in your cleanup, the landfill will not charge a fee for Bountiful residents during fall cleanup week or the following week (October 17-21)

so trash that does not comply with the above restrictions can be disposed of at no charge. Landfill fees will still be in place for concrete and construction materials during the cleanup weeks. We do not accept propane tanks or tires of any kind at the landfill.

W.I.C. is an equal opportunity provider that provides fresh fruits and vegetables plus a variety of other healthy foods to those who qualify. Qualification tips: pregnant women count as two in the household, foster children and Medicaid recipients automatically qualify, U.S. citizenship is not required and dads and grandparent guardians may also qualify.
