IT'S A BOUNTIFUL SUMMER!

It's summertime in Bountiful, and the summer of 2012 will be another great one with all the community events planned in the upcoming months. I so enjoy this time of year as we are out and about more enjoying all that Bountiful has to offer. It is great seeing so many of you enjoying this season as well, supporting our community events and taking advantage of good weather, good food, and the opportunity to spend time with family and neighbors! There will be something for everyone!

First up is the Bountiful Chalk Art Festival on Main Street in downtown Bountiful May 16th - 18th. Many local people with great artistic talent have registered for the festival. All are invited to come down, stroll Main Street with friends and neighbors and view the beautiful chalk art. A good place to start is at Main Street where it intersects with Center Street.

Next is the Bountiful Rotary Coats for Kids Car Show which will be held on Friday and Saturday, June 15th and 16th. This event is a fund raiser to provide winter coats, boots and gloves for Bountiful kids. See the article on page two for more information.

It's the 12th year of Bountiful's Farmers Market, which opens this year on Thursday, June 21st and is open every Thursday until the middle of October. It is located at 100 East and 100 South on the grounds of the U of U extension (also known as Stoker School). If you haven't been to the Bountiful Farmer's Market before, you will be amazed at the wonderful sights, tastes and smells that are there. By popular demand, they have expanded their hours, and now will be open from 3:00 p.m. until dusk. There will be new vendors this year as well! Concerts in the Park will be held Friday nights on June 22nd, July 13th and 27th, and August 3rd and 17th. There will be music for all tastes. The concerts are free at the bowery at the City Park on 400 North and 200 West. These are organized by our Bountiful Community Service Council, and more information is on page three.

The traditional Handcart Days Parade will be on Main Street (from 1500 South to the 400 North Park) on Friday, July 20th, at 6:00 p.m. Fireworks will be displayed that night at about 10 p.m. at the park just east of Mueller Park Junior High on 1800 South, and there will be activities in the park on both Friday and Saturday, July 21st. The Bountiful City Cemetery will also hold its walking tour on Sunday evening, July 22nd. The parade, activities, food and fireworks are always spectacular and something you won't want to miss! Bountiful Summerfest will host eight international performing groups this year. The traditional street dance will be held on August 9th on Main Street (between Center Street and 100 South), along with SummerFeast—a variety of local restaurants serving palate- and wallet-pleasing food for purchase. From August 9th to 11th the festival will continue at the 400 North Park and will include dances, ethnic food booths, 50 artists booths, and a children's art yard sponsored by KUED. This is brought to us by the Bountiful/Davis Arts Center.

The Bountiful Emergency Preparedness Fair will be on Saturday, October 13th, at Woods Cross High School. This will include demonstrations, vendor booths, and other useful information for emergencies that may come our way.

VOTE BY MAIL

The 2012 election in November will be a busy one with voting for President, U.S. Senator, Governor, and many other federal, state and local offices (but not Bountiful City Council). If you would like the convenience of voting from home, having time to review candidate names and platforms and other ballot issues, and would like to avoid going to a polling location and standing in line on election day, then perhaps you should consider voting by mail this year.

Any registered voter may apply to become a permanent by-mail voter and receive a ballot for every election. Those registering to vote for the first

time may also become a permanent by-mail voter if desired. Simply obtain and complete a voter registration form, and be sure to mark the box that indicates your desire to be on the permanent absentee voter list. A registration form may be obtained via the internet at <http://www.elections.utah.gov/> and clicking on "REGISTER TO VOTE." You may also call the Davis County Clerk/Auditor's office at 801.451.3588 to request a registration form.

If you later decide you no longer wish to vote by mail, you can easily change your registration by contacting the Davis County Clerk/Auditor's office.



POWER PLANT UPDATE AND BLUE STAKE INFORMATION

Bountiful City Light & Power (BCLP) continues to increase its capacity to generate electricity with the recent arrival of two gas fired turbines. With Phase II of the power plant project nearly complete, one turbine was delivered at the newly reconfigured power plant on 200 West on Tuesday, March 28, one day later than scheduled due to inclement weather. The second turbine was delivered the next day. The turbines were shipped from San Diego, CA in four parts (two generator sections and two turbine sections) on four semi trucks. The total weight of all four components is nearly 200 tons!

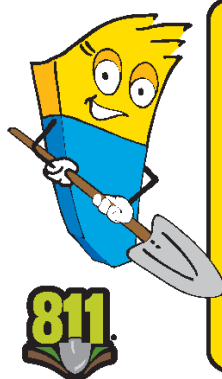
It is expected that the new turbines will be ready to run by July of this year, just in time for the summer season peaks.

Monday, May 21st through Wednesday, May 23rd (the week prior to Memorial Day): In order to help with last-minute manicuring of

Monday, June 4th (the Monday after Memorial Day): Please pick up any flowers or decorations you want to save before that date. Remember: It’s illegal to take anything off a grave you do not own!

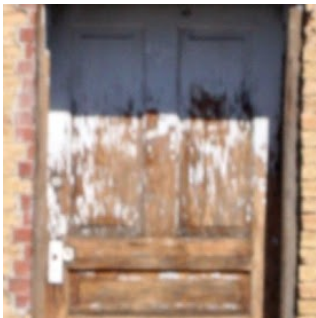
We hope you’ll have a chance to drive through and enjoy the beauty of the cemetery during the holiday weekend.

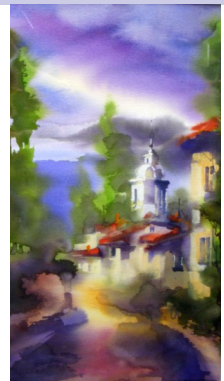

BOUNTIFUL HANDCART DAYS

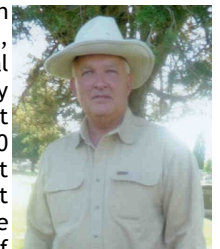
The theme for this year’s Handcart Days celebration is “They Did Not Doubt!” It is a theme that applies to all early pioneers as well as to pioneers present and future. The celebration will begin on Friday, July 20th, and continue on Saturday, July 21st. On both days there will be food, rides, pioneer games, entertainment, mountain men, and other park activities at the Bountiful City Park on 400 North. The Grand Parade will begin at 6:00 p.m. on Friday and will proceed north along Main Street from 1500 South to 400 North. The parade will have many special entries, but will have one entry unlike anything ever tried before. This year, complementing the Handcart Days’ theme, 2000 young men dressed as stripling warriors and led by Helaman will march down the street striking their spears on the pavement as they walk. They aim to set a Guinness World Record as “the largest gathering
