

Flood Hazard Information

The US Congress has mandated all federally insured lenders to require flood insurance on properties that are located in "Special Flood Hazard Areas" which are those areas determined to have a 1% or greater chance of flooding in any given year. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) issues maps known as Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM), to help determine the flood risks for real property. FIRMs can be viewed over the internet using FEMA's Map Service Center: https://msc.fema.gov/portal/search The Bountiful City Engineering Department can assist inquirers about flood insurance and flood information for specific properties as follows: the flood zone, whether property is in a "floodway", flood depth (where information is available), flood-related hazards, natural floodplain functions, historic flood information, and flood protection measures. Engineering staff can also do site visits and give recommendations for flood protection. Copies of FEMA Elevation Certificates are available for some of the properties. A brochure about Utah floods is available to anyone interested.
