BOUNTIFUL COMMUNITIES THAT CARE

It's now fall in Bountiful and the summer of 2012 was another fantastic season in our community. I am always happy to see so many of you at the wonderful events which take place in and around Bountiful as you enjoy the great weather and warm sunshine.

Bountiful Communities That Care was also busy this summer carrying out their mission to foster increased collaboration and cooperation in our community to serve the needs of youth.

Bountiful Communities That Care (BCTC) is a coalition-based non-profit organization. BCTC was started by Second District Court Judge Thomas Kay and Bountiful City Police Chief Tom Ross, and shares a close alliance with Bountiful City. To effectively address the community's specific youth issues, BCTC community programs are targeted to strengthen family and peer relationships, improve academic progress, and discourage substance abuse. This is done in an effort to create a healthy youth and a healthier community.

During the summer, BCTC hosted a free sixteen week academic program at South Davis Junior High School. The free class was a remediation and refresher-type program which covered reading, writing, vocabulary, math, science, and cryptography. Students from around the community in grades four through nine participated. Volunteer instructors and parents from around the area contributed time and resources throughout the summer making

the program a success. And because the program was so effective, the Davis County School District has now agreed to assist BCTC in turning the program into a year-round opportunity for our community.

In addition, BCTC hosted a 3-on-3 basketball tournament (held in the spring), The Davis Youth Summit (which will be hosted by Bountiful in January, 2013), a Town Hall Meeting for parents and youth, and parenting workshops entitled "Guiding Good Choices," "Strengthening Families" and "The Incredible Years."

As we welcome fall, many other BCTC events are scheduled including a slogan completion, a youth volleyball tournament, family ice skating nights, and multiple parenting classes that will be taught in different locations around the city in January and February of 2013.

As Mayor, I extend a warm invitation to you to find out more about Bountiful Communities That Care. You can create lasting community change by getting involved, as there are many different ways to help promote healthy youth development in our community. The Mayor and Council feel it is now time to move forward to provide permanent and progressive leadership into the future. This is an exciting time for Boun-

TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HAPPY HOLIDAY SEASON

Always check for overhead power lines before stringing outdoor lights. Never place yourself or any object in a position where you or the object may come in contact with a power line – the result may be fatal. Look up before using ladders or other objects and stay at least 10 feet away from overhead lines. Other safety tips include:

- Use lights and extension cords designed for outdoor use if placing them outside.
- Use only lighting and cords approved by the Underwriters Laboratories (UL), an independent, nonprofit organization that tests electrical components and equipment for potential hazards.
- When hanging lights, make sure that nails and staples do not pierce or pinch wires.
- Check all indoor and outdoor decorative lighting for frayed cords, broken wires and loose connections. Discard damaged lights and cords.
- Follow the manufacturer's specification for the number of light strings that can be safely connected together.
- Turn off indoor and outdoor decorative lights when leaving the house and before going to sleep.
- Consider using LED holiday lighting. Most LED lights are shatter and shock resistant, last much longer than conventional incandescent bulbs, produce almost no heat, greatly reducing the risk of fire, are cooler and safer to touch, and use less electricity making it less likely to overload a circuit.

TAX HELP AVAILABLE AT CITY HALL

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program will again be available at Bountiful City Hall beginning in February 2013. If your annual household or individual income is \$50,000 or less, IRS-trained community volunteers will prepare your federal and state taxes free of charge. These tax preparers are especially proficient in getting all the special credits you may be allowed under tax law.



The VITA volunteers will be available at City Hall each Wednesday evening from 5:30-8:30 p.m., from February 6 through April 10, 2013. If you would like to make an appointment to get your taxes done, call 2-1-1 after the third week in January and they will schedule a time for you and inform you of what documents you will need to bring to the appointment. Walk-ins are also welcome, but will be assisted after those with appointments.

HELP NEEDED!

The Bountiful Community Food Pantry serves 600 - 700 families each month who live in southern Davis County. There are several ways to help others during the holiday season: participate in the Sub-for-Santa program in December as a Santa, make food or financial donations, have your schools/businesses/churches host food drives, and/or fill selected volunteer openings at the pantry including experienced forklift drivers to work in the warehouse.



In the last 12 months the pantry has distributed over 2 million pounds of food, provided services 15,892 times to 50,136 individuals and helped countless individuals find jobs and move out of crisis mode. All of this is done with only two employees and countless regularly scheduled volunteers.

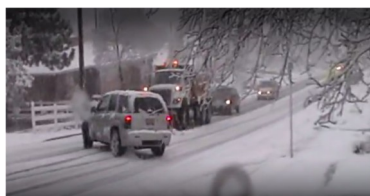
SNOW REMOVAL

56-2-115). Do not defeat the efforts of our snow plow drivers by putting snow into the street. It is dangerous!

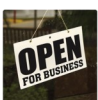
CHICKENS

There is a new code in town! Bountiful Code 14-22-101 now allows chickens to be kept on a Single-Family Residential Lot. A short application and \$5.00 is all that is needed to obtain a city license for keeping up to eight hens (no roosters). BOUNTIFUL HISTORICAL COMMISSION/HISTORY MUSEUM NEWS

Probably everyone in Bountiful knows that Stoker Elementary School (now the University of Utah Bountiful extension) was one of the area's earliest schools. But did you know that in the 1850s, an even earlier school was built on the corner of 500 North and 200 West? Made from adobe brick, the building served as a school, an LDS Sunday School meetinghouse, and a town hall. In conjunction with the 100th Anniversary of the Davis County School District, an historical marker will soon be installed near the site of the Adobe School. Stay tuned for more details.

WINTER PARKING IN BOUNTIFUL

It's that time of year again when the City's winter parking ordinance goes into effect. In an effort to help our Street Department continue doing such an excellent job clearing the snow from the roadways, we are asking for your cooperation in not parking your vehicles on the street when prohibited as outlined below.



Bountiful City Parking Ordinance § 13-1-103 states:

“It is unlawful for any person who owns or has possession, custody, or control of any vehicle to park or allow to be parked any vehicle or trailer on any street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of November, December, January, February, and March.”

The ordinance also prohibits parking vehicles on the street when it is actually snowing, or within twelve hours thereafter. This prohibition does not include Main Street between 500 South and 400 North. Officers will be putting warnings on vehicles left parked on the street for the first two weeks of November. After that, officers will begin issuing parking citations on all vehicles that are left on the street in violation of this ordinance.
