HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM Bountiful residents only

Bountiful City will be conducting a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program on Saturday, October 9, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the City's Maintenance Facility located at 950 South 200 West. HOLIDAY GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICKUP

Garbage and recycling are picked up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. During Thanksgiving week, Thursday's garbage and recycling will be picked up on Friday and Friday's garbage and recycling will be picked up on Saturday. Since the Christmas and New Year's Day holidays fall on Saturdays, garbage and recycling will be picked up on your normal garbage day and pick up will not be affected by those holidays this year. **Please place your containers out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.**

FALL LEAF PICK UP

As autumn approaches, Bountiful City crews provide the extra service of picking up leaves from your park strip until the trucks need to be made ready to plow for our winter storms. If possible, please bag your leaves so they won't be blown away or plug storm drains. There is no need to call the City to schedule a pick up unless the leaves/bags have been set out for longer than two weeks.



Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up

Full clean up week is October 4-8. During that week, City crews will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed in addition to the regular pick up. Limbs and trees must be cut in five-foot lengths, bundled and **tyed with twine**. Each bundle, bag or box must not exceed 50 pounds. Please separate metal items from your other debris as metal recycling crews will be picking up those items. Concrete and construction materials will not be picked up curb side. All items including old furniture or appliances must be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. **Please note that fall clean up items will be picked up by several different clean up crews at different times or on days other than your regu-**

lar garbage day, so all of your clean up items may not be picked up at the same time. Please have your clean up items and your garbage containers out for our crews to pick up before 7:00 a.m. on your regular garbage day. Lids must be closed when put out for collection.

COMPLIANCE TO THE SPECIAL CLEAN UP REGULATIONS IS MANDATORY. TRASH THAT DOES NOT MEET THE ABOVE REGULATIONS NEEDS TO BE TAKEN TO THE LANDFILL BY THE PROPERTY OWNER AND WILL NOT BE PICKED UP BY CITY STAFF. Accordingly, these items can be taken to the landfill and disposed of at NO CHARGE FOR BOUNTIFUL RESIDENTS during clean up week and the following week (October 11-16—proof of residency is required at the

2021 Municipal Election

Bountiful's Municipal Election is November 2. It's easy to register to vote or update your information at vote.utah.gov until October 22, 2021. Ballots will start arriving in mailboxes on or about October 12. Once you have completed your ballot, it can be deposited in the ballot box located outside the west door of the library (725 South Main Street), any other ballot box in Davis County or in any United States Postal Service mailbox. In-person voting on Election Day will take place at the South Davis Branch of the library. FIRMs Adoption Delayed

Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps were released September 30, 2019 by FEMA for Davis County. The proposed changes show a 40% reduction in regulated flood zone area in Bountiful City and more accurately represent the flood risk to Bountiful properties. The preliminary maps were anticipated to become effective spring of 2021. However, because of some errors that were found in the Flood Insurance Study report, the preliminary maps must again go through FEMA's process for appeal, a review of any appeals received and resolution to the point FEMA can finally determine that the maps are going to become effective. At this point, FEMA will issue a Notice of Final Determination letter six months prior to the maps becoming effective and will include an effective date. The target date for the preliminary maps becoming effective is now May 2022.

Look for the link to the "Interactive Map" under "Quick Links", find the "Themes" menu and turn on the layer "SFHA Preliminary 2019" (the base theme can also be changed to a satellite view for an aerial perspective).

Water Conservation—helpful information

With the declaration of a drought by Governor Cox in March, water conservation guidelines have been put in place to help conserve and use this resource wisely. Thank you for helping with this effort!

Bountiful City residents have four different irrigation sources depending on where you live:

- **Bountiful City** - generally east of Bountiful Boulevard
- **Bountiful Irrigation** (not a City entity - formerly known as Weber Water) - most of the City
- **South Davis Water District** - southwest part of the City
- **Deuel Creek Irrigation Company**—a small area in the northwest part of the City.

If you are unsure which entity provides your irrigation water, there is a map available on the City's website which can be found, along with Bountiful City's watering restrictions, at www.bountifulutah.gov - "Culinary Water Restrictions". Please call or visit your provider's website to find out what the watering restrictions are for your area.

Bountiful City is continuing to practice water conservation in the City. In addition to cutting back watering by 60-70%, fertilizers with wedding agents are used to maximize watering efficiency and City Staff is constantly monitoring and repairing watering systems. If you see sprinklers on at a City property during the day, it is most likely a repair or test being done and they will only on for a short time! If you see City sprinklers that appear to have been on a long time, please call us at 801.298.6140 as they could need to be adjusted.
