Bountiful City Awarded Honors

Recently, Bountiful was listed as one of the top 100 "Best Places to Live" in the United States by *Money Magazine*. In describing Bountiful, *Money Magazine* said, "This bedroom community north of Salt Lake City has become a booming, self-sufficient place." It went on to say "the most prized homes in the area are on the Bountiful Bench, offering great views of the lake, valley and mountains."

In their August 2009 edition, *Golf Digest* ranked Bountiful Ridge as the "Best Municipal Golf Course" in Utah. *Golf Digest* defined municipal golf courses as any course owned by a city, town, county or state. Further, *Golf Digest* selected Bountiful as the best bargain in public golf in the nation. In selecting Bountiful Ridge Golf Course for this honor, *Golf Digest* said, "Northern Utah is home to our favorite. Others might cost a little less, but at \$24, Bountiful Ridge Golf Course's vistas of the Wasatch Range and the Great Salt Lake come at no extra charge. With greens scarier than an Olympic downhill run, a waterfall framing the reachable par-5 18th [hole], and a snack-shop chili-cheese dog that will make you forget your name, this eminently walkable and meticulously maintained muni in Bountiful defines the essence of public golf; affordable, home-spun and exceptional."

Bountiful City recently received its 29th consecutive award for Excellence in Financial Reporting, the highest award that can

be given for a Comprehensive Annual Financial Report issued annually by a governmental organization. Bountiful has received this award longer and in more consecutive years than any other city in the state, and it is an award that very few cities even attempt to achieve.

Bountiful City has also been recognized by the Utah Taxpayers Association as having the lowest property tax rate of any of the 20 largest cities in the state of Utah. Additionally, Bountiful's utility rates were lower than any of the 20 largest cities in the state.

Commenting on the awards and recognitions that Bountiful has recently received, City Manager Tom Hardy noted that the recognition is a result of the combined efforts of a Mayor and

City Council who have kept the interests of the citizens foremost in their minds when making decisions, dedicated professional employees who give extraordinary effort to providing world-class services to its citizens, and a citizenry that is dedicated to the community in which they live, and reflects that dedication in the way they maintain their private properties, take care of their neighbors, and volunteer their time. "It's nice to be recognized by outside groups, but the praise that we covet most comes from our citizens who we attempt to serve in a courteous, professional way each day. We are certainly not perfect, but we strive to use best practices, learn from our mistakes, and continually improve our performance."

Bountiful City's Fall Clean Up

All cleanup is October 5 thru October 9. During that week city crews on your regular garbage pickup day will also remove trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed. Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and *tied* in 5-foot lengths. Any bundles, bags or boxes must not exceed 50 lbs. Items such as old furniture or appliances should be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk. Please place your items out by 7:00 a.m. on your garbage day.

Also, to assist you in your

cleanup, the landfill will not charge a fee to the residents of Bountiful during fall cleanup week or the following week so trash that does not comply with the above restriction can be disposed of at no charge. We can no longer accept propane tanks or tires of any kind at the landfill.

What you should know when you go to the polls in November

In November, Bountiful citizens will elect a Mayor and two Council Members. On that same November ballot, they will likely see candidates for the South Davis Sewer Board and the option to approve or not approve bonds for the Davis School District.

A Primary election will be held Tuesday, September 15, 2009, to narrow the candidates to four for City Council and two for Mayor. The following have filed to run for Mayor and City Council (listed in alphabetical order by last name):

The General Election will occur on Tuesday, November 3, 2009. Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. for both elections.

Voters will be required to show identification at the polls before being allowed to vote. The quickest way to satisfy this requirement is with a current Utah driver's license. If you do not have a current driver's license, see our website for a list of other acceptable identification.

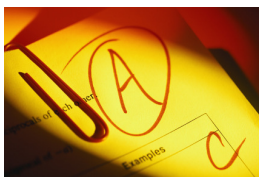
A Reminder – Holiday Garbage Pick-up
