## WATCH FOR THE ORANGE CONES AND BARRELS!

**T**his is the season for construction work on the roadways in and around Bountiful City, which means you will be seeing a lot of orange cones and barrels. Not only will crews be working on City streets, but the part of I-15 that runs adjacent to Bountiful City will be getting a face lift as well!

The I-15 construction began in April to improve mobility on I-15 and east/west corridors in south Davis County to meet current traffic needs. This project will:

- ◆ Add ExpressLanes in both directions from the north I-215 interchange to U.S. 89/ Park Lane in Farmington.
- ◆ Replace aging bridges at 2600 South, 1500 South, 500 South and 400 North.
- ◆ Reconfigure the interchanges at 2600 South and 500 South in Bountiful to improve east/west mobility.
- ◆ Improve active transportation with better pedestrian facilities at 500 South, 400 North and Parrish Lane.

I-15 will remain open without restrictions during peak hours. However, to avoid delays, please consider an alternate route, such as Legacy Parkway, or use FrontRunner for your daily commute. FrontRunner provides all-day service with 30-minute frequency during peak hours. To make using FrontRunner even better, we've partnered with UTA to provide you with a free 7-day FrontRunner pass. Register for your free pass at [rideuta.com/i15davis](http://rideuta.com/i15davis). Supplies are limited. Davis County residents only. For updates and current information, visit [www.udot.utah.gov/i15southdavis](http://www.udot.utah.gov/i15southdavis). This project will continue for approximately 18 months.

Within Bountiful City limits, 400 East from

Pages Lane south to 1130 North will be closed for approximately 90 days while it is being resurfaced, with water lines also being replaced there. Alternate routes include Main Street and 200 West. Water lines will also be replaced on 1000 North from the west side of Viewmont High School to Chapel Drive, then south on Chapel Drive to 800 North including the 900 North cul-de-sac; 550 North from Main Street to 400 East; 1500 East from 1200 South to Millbrook Way and

Millbrook Way from 1500 East to approx. 1381 East; 425 West from 325 South to Center Street; and 300 West from 150 South to Center Street. Other Water Department projects will be located at 400 East Millcreek Way, 700 North 600 East, 900 North 900 East, and 100 North from 600 East to end of the cul-de-sac. The well on 100 East and 1030 South will also be rehabilitated this summer, and there will be the regularly scheduled street overlaying projects in Bountiful neighborhoods.

Other projects around the City will include replacing the traffic signal at 400 North and Main Street, replacing the storm drain line from the north end of Horsley Circle to Millcreek. The playground and pavilion at the City Park on 400 North and 200 West have been rebuilt and there are upgrades at Brickyard Park on 200 West and 1050 South. A reminder to Bountiful Residents—dogs are not permitted in posted picnic, pond, or play areas [City Code 8-2-149(b)].

With the increase in traffic on most through north-south City streets that the I-15 construction will necessitate, and possible delays there and around the City construction sites, please remember to drive courteously, slow down, allow plenty of time to get to your destination and follow directions on the temporary signs around these areas. Have a great summer and drive safely!

Cemetery staff are already working and preparing the grounds for the holiday weekend. Visitors, please be aware of the following dates:

**Saturday, May 17<sup>th</sup> - Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup>** (the week prior to Memorial Day): In order



to help with last-minute manicuring of the cemetery, all ground-level decorations will be cleaned up. Please do not deliver flowers or decorations to the cemetery prior to Thursday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>. **Monday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>** (the Monday after Memorial Day): Please pick up any flowers or decorations you want to save before that date. Remember: It's illegal to take anything off a grave you do not own!

We hope you'll have a chance to drive through and enjoy the beauty of the cemetery during the holiday weekend.

The celebration begins Wednesday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>, with park activities at the improved Bountiful City Park (400 North and 200 West). The grand parade starts Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. Fireworks light up the sky Wednesday night approximately 10:00 p.m. at Mueller Park Junior High, and park activities begin again Thursday, July 24<sup>th</sup>. Additionally, on July 26<sup>th</sup> the Bountiful Historic Commission will be conducting bus tours from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. every hour on the hour for a total of five tours. These



tours leave from the Willey Cabin which is located just north of City Hall. Bountiful Tabernacle tours will be conducted hourly on the half hour from 9:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. Cemetery tours will be on Sunday evening, July 27<sup>th</sup> from 6:30 until 8:30 p.m. Let's celebrate!
