Puzzled by the tax law or which credits and deductions to take? Need assistance with your tax return? If you qualify, we can help! The **IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA)** offers free tax help if you qualify (low to moderate income—\$49,000 or less).

Volunteers will be at Bountiful City Hall on Wednesday evenings from February 6 until April 10. To make an appointment, find out if you qualify or to find other VITA locations, please call 2-1-1. Walk-ins are accepted, but those with appointments will be given preference.

### Municipal Elections Information

The City of Bountiful will have an election this year in which citizens will choose a Mayor and two City Council members. Any qualified candidate wishing to run for one of the positions must file, in person in the City Recorder's office (790 South 100 East, Bountiful, Utah), between June 1 and 6 p.m. on June 17, 2013.



Qualifications for candidacy are as follow:

- (1) Be a United States citizen at time of filing.
- (2) Be at least 18 years old at the time of the November municipal election.
- (3) Be a registered voter of the municipality.
- (4) Be a legal resident of the municipality or a resident of a recently annexed area for 12 months immediately preceding the date of the November election.
- (5) Not be a convicted felon currently incarcerated or a mentally incompetent person whose right to hold elective office has not been restored.

If a Primary Election is necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, August 13, 2013. The General Election will be Tuesday, November 5, 2013.

### Bountiful City's Spring Clean Up

Bountiful City's 2013 Spring Clean Up will be April 15 through 19. On your regular garbage day during that week, city crews will remove, in addition to your regular garbage, trash and refuse which has been properly bundled, bagged or boxed as follows:

- Limbs and trees must be cut, bundled and tied in 5-foot lengths.
- Each bundle, bag or box must be placed on the drive approach or park strip and not exceed 50 lbs.
- Items such as old furniture or appliances should also be placed on the drive approach or park strip, not on the street or sidewalk.

Other reminders from the Streets and Sanitation Departments (see related article on page 3):

• GARBAGE CONTAINERS SHOULD BE PLACED AT THE CURB NO LATER THAN 7 A.M. ON YOUR REGULAR PICKUP DAY. LIDS MUST BE CLOSED WHEN PUT OUT FOR COLLECTION.

• LANDFILL SUMMER HOURS (April through October) Closed Sunday & Holidays Monday through Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

• COMPOST IS AVAILABLE FOR SALE AT THE LANDFILL FOR YOUR SPRING GARDENING—COMPOST INCREASES WATER RETENTION IN YOUR SOIL. COST: \$30.00 PER TON OR \$2.00 PER BAG

Also, to assist you in your Spring Clean Up, the landfill will not charge Bountiful residents a fee during Spring Clean Up week or the following week so trash that does not meet the above guidelines can be disposed of at no charge. PLEASE NOTE: The landfill no longer accepts propane tanks or tires

### Storm Water and Flood Hazard Information

As water flows from our yards, driveways, and streets down the gutter and into the drain it can pick up dirt, leaves, litter, pesticides, fertilizer, oil, harmful bacteria in pet waste and other pollutants. This water flows directly from our storm drains to our streams and wetlands without being treated. Remember to keep our storm drains and creeks clean; please do not place anything in the gutters that may wash down into the storm drains. Federally-insured lenders must require flood insurance for any property that has a high risk of flooding. The Federal Emergency Management Agency

(FEMA) issues Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) to help determine flood risk to a property. Areas determined to have a 1% or greater chance of flooding in any given year are considered high risk areas. The Bountiful City Engineering Department can assist inquirers about flood insurance, flood zones, and flood protection for specific properties (801.298.6125). ### Update on 138 Substation Upgrade

Over the past few years, Bountiful City Light & Power (BCLP) has been working on a major, top priority upgrade at our 138 kV substation in Centerville. At this substation, power is delivered to the City from outside power resources and made suitable for delivery to BCLP customers.



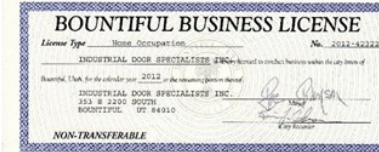
A major part of this project has involved replacing the single circuit breaker that had been the only feed into the City for 44 years, which has been accomplished

in the last few months, and installing a second 138,000 volt circuit breaker, which was put in place in 2011.

The project has also included replacing other older equipment and work is scheduled to be completed in March, 2013. The completion of this phase of the project allows BCLP to perform important maintenance on the breakers and other equipment in the substation, and adds increased system capacity and reliability.

### Renew Your Business License Now!

BUSINESS OWNERS.... Don't forget to renew your 2013 business license EARLY. Late fees will be assessed if not paid by February 14 - 50% of total license fees until March 31, and 100% of total license fees thereafter.

### Some Reminders for Bountiful Residents!

**WINTER PARKING**  
"It is unlawful for any person who owns or has possession, custody, or control of any vehicle to park or allow to be parked any vehicle or trailer on any street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of November, December, January, February, and March." The ordinance also prohibits parking vehicles on the street when it is actually snowing, or within twelve hours thereafter, except on Main Street between 400 North and 500 South.

**SNOW REMOVAL**  
Remove snow from the sidewalks adjacent to your property within 24 hours after a snow storm. (City Ord. 56-2-115). Making sure your sidewalks are clear makes it safer for pedestrians and drivers during the winter months. Do not blow or shovel snow off your driveway or sidewalk into the street. (City Ord. 56-2-115). Do not defeat the efforts of our snow plow drivers by putting snow into the street. It is dangerous!
